



A Profile of Victims of Crime North Tyneside, 2008/09

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KEY MESSAGES

In 2008/09 there were 8,081 (people) victims of crimes committed in North Tyneside. 88% of these victims also lived in North Tyneside.

Of victims where the crime was committed in North Tyneside in 2008/09:

- One quarter were subjected to crimes of a violent nature.
- One quarter were aged 18-29.
- 53% were male, with males accounting for 48% of the resident population of North Tyneside.
- 4.7% came from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group, compared to 4% of the total population.
- 55% were in employment.

Of the 8,049 victims who had a home address within North Tyneside in 2008/09:

- Almost a quarter (24%) were subjected to crimes of a violent nature.
- 42% were aged 30-49.
- 53% were male.
- 4% were from a BME group.
- 54% were in employment.

During 2008/09 2,010 violent crimes were committed in North Tyneside:

- 77% were committed by a stranger.
- 89% of violent offences committed against males were carried out by a stranger, compared to 65% against women.
- 31% of female violent crime victims were subjected to domestic violence.

During 2008/09 in North Tyneside there were on average:

- 168 victims of violent crime per month. July to September quarter saw the most victims of this crime type.
- 287 victims of violent crime per day of the week. Fridays and Saturdays saw the highest numbers.
- There was a steady increase in the number of victims of violent crime from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 12-1am. The number of victims between 9pm and 2am accounted for 41% of all violent crime victims.

During 2008/09:

- There were 9,989 items of stolen property recorded by Northumbria police. The total value of property stolen (including that recovered) was £3,611,071.
- 1,615 (16%) stolen items were recovered. The total value of property recovered was £665,489.

In 2008/09 there were 3,880 business victims of crime committed in North Tyneside. One third of these crimes were against Northumbria Police. 39% of crimes against all business victims were Theft Other offences. This category includes 'Theft from shops and stalls', which accounted for three quarters (1,126) of these business victims. During the same year, there were 2,440 business victims of crime in North Tyneside, where the business 'home' address was given as being in North Tyneside.

This report aims to give an overview of the demographic profile of victims, identifying particular groups of people who experience disproportionate levels of crime. Where the crime was committed and the home address of the victim is analysed. The type of property stolen is also profiled, along with a brief profile on businesses that have been victims of crime. Temporal analysis has also been undertaken, as crime trends can be influenced by a range of factors that fluctuate according to time of the week or time of the year.

Data are provided for one year only, 2008/09, therefore care should be taken when drawing conclusions.

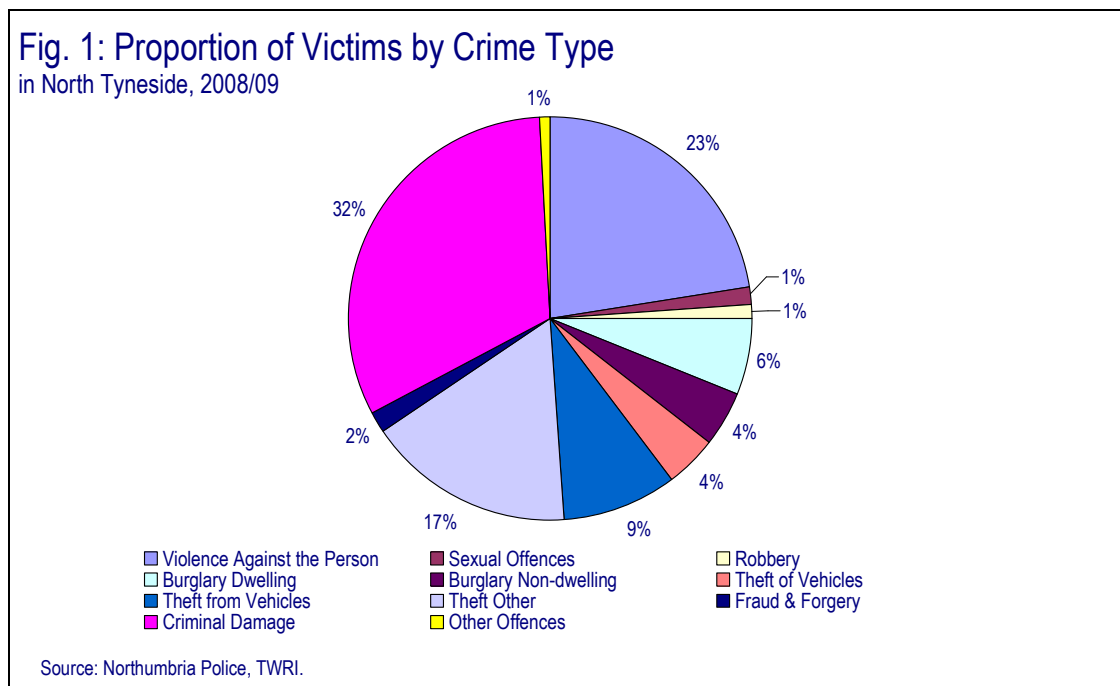
1. Demographic Profile of Victims of Crime – Where the Crime was Committed in North Tyneside

Data within section 1 refers to the characteristics of victims where the crime against them occurred within North Tyneside, independently of their home address.

1.1 Distribution of Different Types of Crime

In 2008/09 there were 8,081 victims of crimes committed in North Tyneside.

One quarter of these victims were subjected to crimes of a violent¹ nature, whilst almost one third (32%) were victims of Criminal Damage (Fig. 1).



¹ Violent crime comprises Violence Against the Person (VAP), Sexual offences and Robbery. VAP covers the whole spectrum of assaults from pushing and shoving, with no physical harm, to murder.

1.2 Age of Victims

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 43% of victims of crime were aged 30-49 years, this compares to just 29% of the total residential population of North Tyneside.
- 11% of victims of crime were aged 60 or over, compared to 23% of the population.
- 40% of victims of Violence Against the Person and 67% of victims of Sexual Offences were aged under 25, despite this age group representing only 29% of the residential population.
- Just over two fifths (42%) of victims of Burglary Dwelling were aged between 30 and 49 years, this age group accounted for 29% of the residential population.
- Over half the victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were aged 30-49 years.

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Almost one fifth (19%) victims of Theft of Vehicles were under the age of 25; whilst for Theft from Vehicles 13% were within this age group.
- The age of victims of Theft Other (which includes Theft from the Person and Theft of Pedal Cycle) was well distributed across the whole age spectrum, with the exception of those under 18 years old, where it was lower.
- Those aged 30 or over were more likely to be a victim of Fraud & Forgery, than those aged under 30 (13% of all victims of Fraud & Forgery).
- The age of victims of Criminal Damage was well distributed across the whole age spectrum, with the exception of those aged under 18 years old, where it was lower.

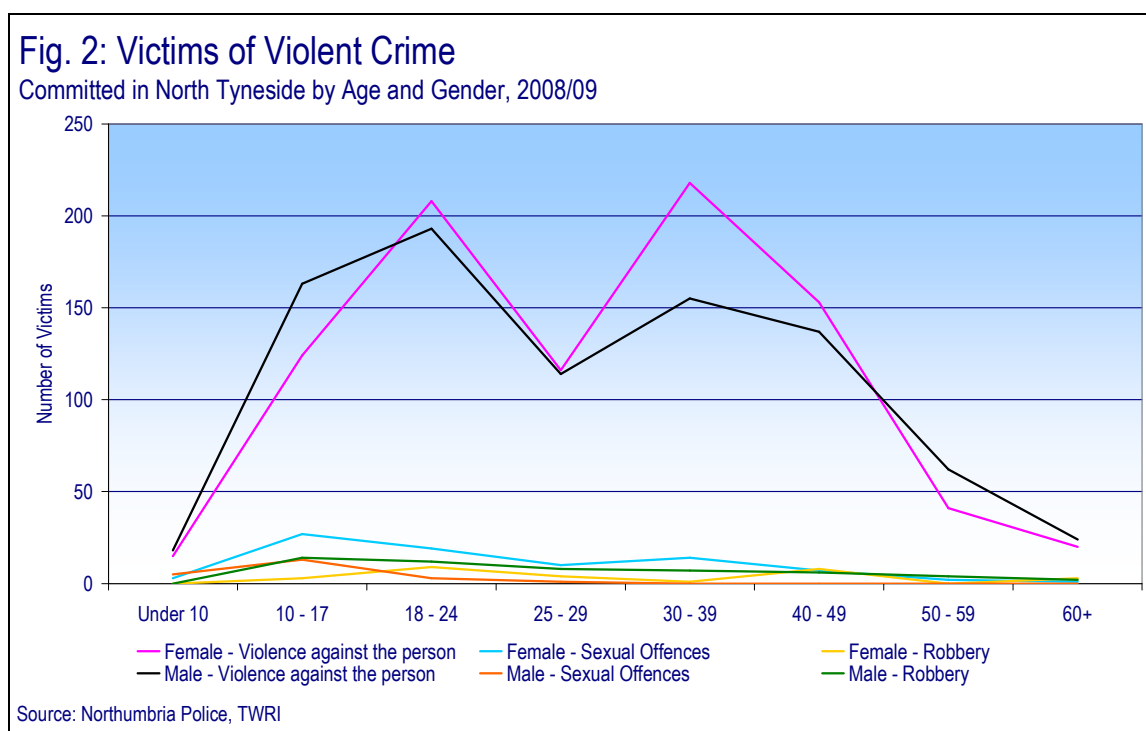

1.3 Gender of Victims

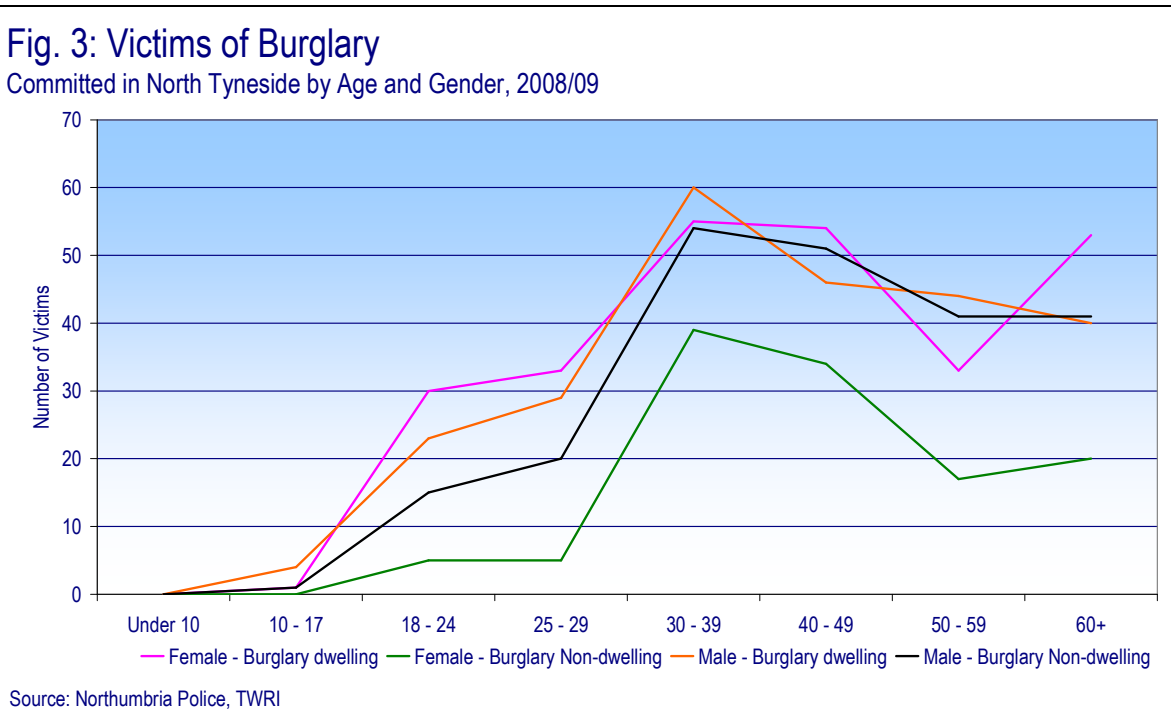
In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 53% of victims of crime were male despite accounting for only 48% of the residential population of North Tyneside.
- 51% of male victims of Violence Against the Person offences committed in North Tyneside were aged 18-39 despite this age group representing only 28% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.
- 79% of victims of Sexual Offences were female. 59% of these female victims of Sexual Offences were aged under 25. This age group account for 27% of the female residential population of North Tyneside.
- 21% of victims of Sexual Offences were male. Over 80% of these male victims were under the age of 18 despite this age group representing only 21% of males living in North Tyneside.
- Slightly over a third (35%) of Robbery victims were female. Almost a third (32%) of these female victims were aged 18-24 despite this age group representing only 8% of the total number of females living in North Tyneside.
- Almost two thirds (65%) of Robbery victims were male. Almost half (49%) of male Robbery victims were aged 10-24 despite this age group represents just 19% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.



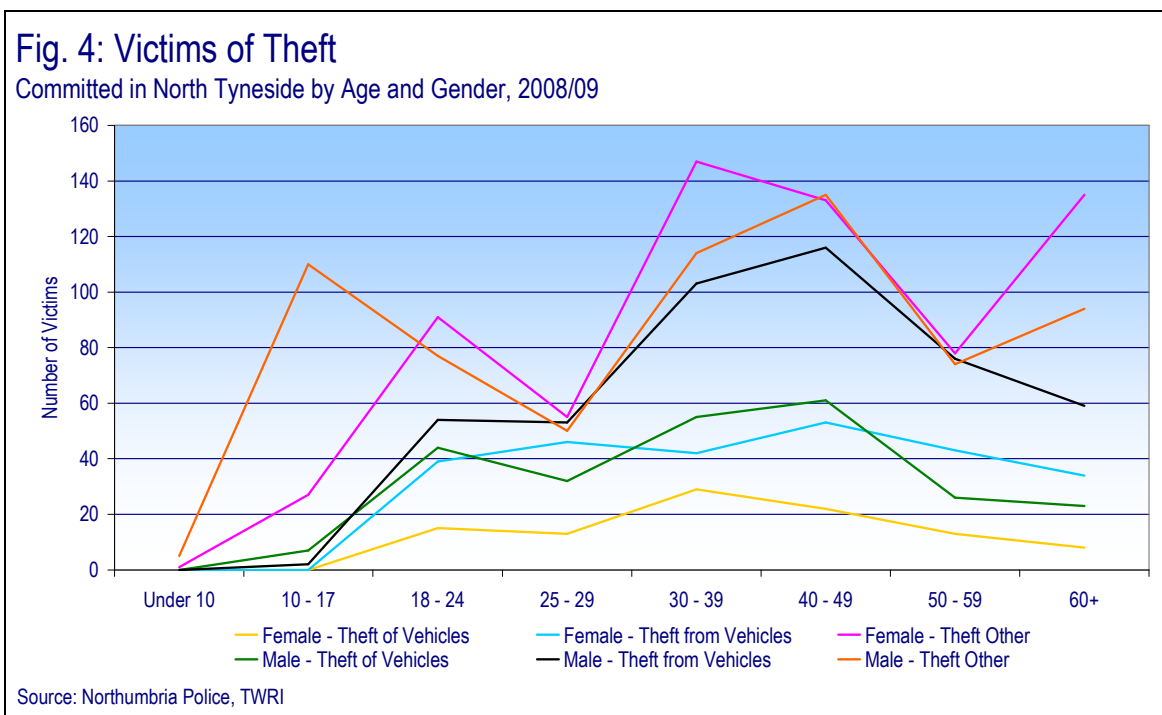
In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Almost two thirds (65%) of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were male. Almost half (46%) of these male victims were aged 30-49. 30-49 year old males represent only 29% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.



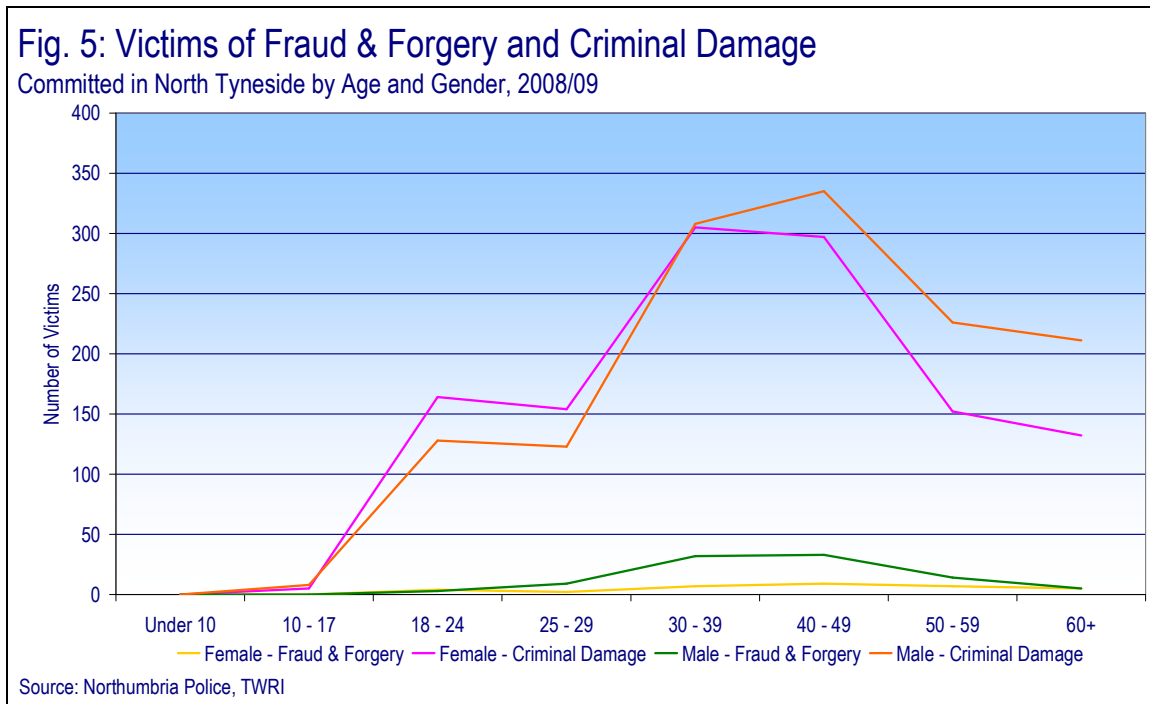
In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Over 70% of Theft of Vehicle victims and almost two thirds (64%) of Theft from Vehicle victims were male.
- Only one fifth of female victims of Theft of Vehicles were aged over 50, despite this age group representing 38% of the female population of North Tyneside.
- 54% of female victims of Theft from Vehicles were aged 25-49 despite this age group accounting for just over a third (34%) of the female residential population of North Tyneside.



In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 73% of victims of Fraud & Forgery were male. One quarter of these male victims were aged 40-49 despite this age group representing only 15% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.
- Slightly over a quarter of victims of Fraud & Forgery (26%) were female.



1.4 Ethnicity of Victims

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 5% of victims of crime were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group, this is a higher proportion than that of the overall population, where 4% were from a BME group.
- 100% of victims of Sexual Offences were White, despite accounting for 96% of the population of North Tyneside.
- 11% of victims of Robbery were of BME origin.

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Approximately 3% of victims of Theft of Vehicles and Theft from Vehicles were from a BME group.
- Over a quarter (28%) of all victims of Fraud & Forgery were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin, this is a higher proportion than that of the overall population, where 1.6% were from this group.

1.5 Occupation of Victims

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 42% of victims of Violence Against the Person were in employment. The occupations with the highest number of victims were: Police Officer (89), Sales/Shop Assistant (62) and Taxi Driver (22).
- 12% of victims of Violence Against the Person were school children and 6% students.
- 43% of victims of Sexual Offences were school children, whilst 27% were unemployed.
- A quarter of Robbery victims were either a school child or student.
- More than half (53%) of Burglary Dwelling victims and 70% of Burglary Non-dwellings were in employment.

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Two thirds of Theft of Vehicles and 76% of Theft from Vehicle victims were in employment. The occupations with the highest number of Thefts from Vehicles were: Managers (38), Taxi drivers (26) and Engineers (22).
- 7% of Fraud & Forgery victims were retired.
- Over half (57%) of Criminal Damage victims were in employment, whilst one fifth were classed as being unemployed.

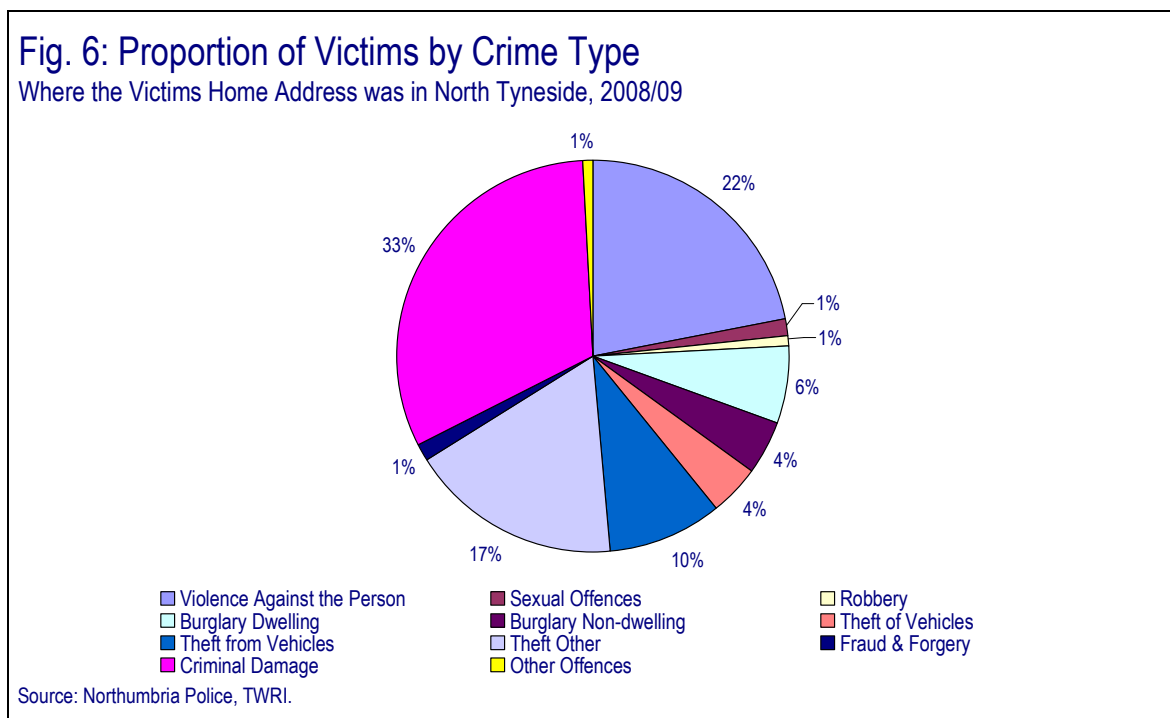
2. Demographic Profile of Victims of Crime – Where the Victims Live in North Tyneside

Data within section 2 refers to the characteristics of victims where the home address was given as being in North Tyneside. The crime will have been committed within Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within North Tyneside.

2.1 Distribution of Different Types of Crime

In 2008/09 8,049 victims of crimes had a home address within North Tyneside. The crime will have been committed within the Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within North Tyneside.

Almost one quarter (24%) of these victims were subjected to crimes of a violent² nature, whilst one third were victims of Criminal Damage (Fig. 6).



² Violent crime comprises Violence Against the Person (VAP), Sexual offences and Robbery. VAP covers the whole spectrum of assaults from pushing and shoving, with no physical harm, to murder.

2.2 Age of Victims

Of victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 43% of victims of Violence Against the Person and 47% of Robbery victims were aged under 25 years old, despite this age group representing only 29% of the residential population of North Tyneside.
- Almost two fifths (37%) of victims of Sexual Offences were between the ages of 10-17. This group accounted for almost 10% of the residential population of North Tyneside.
- 43% of Burglary Dwelling victims and half of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for 29% of the residential population of North Tyneside.

Of victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 48% of victims of Theft of Vehicles and 44% of victims of Thefts from Vehicles were aged 30-49 years old. However, only 29% of the residential population were in this age group.
- 12% of victims of Fraud & Forgery were aged 60 or over, despite this age group accounting for 23% of the residential population of North Tyneside.
- Almost half (48%) of victims of Criminal Damage were aged 30-49.

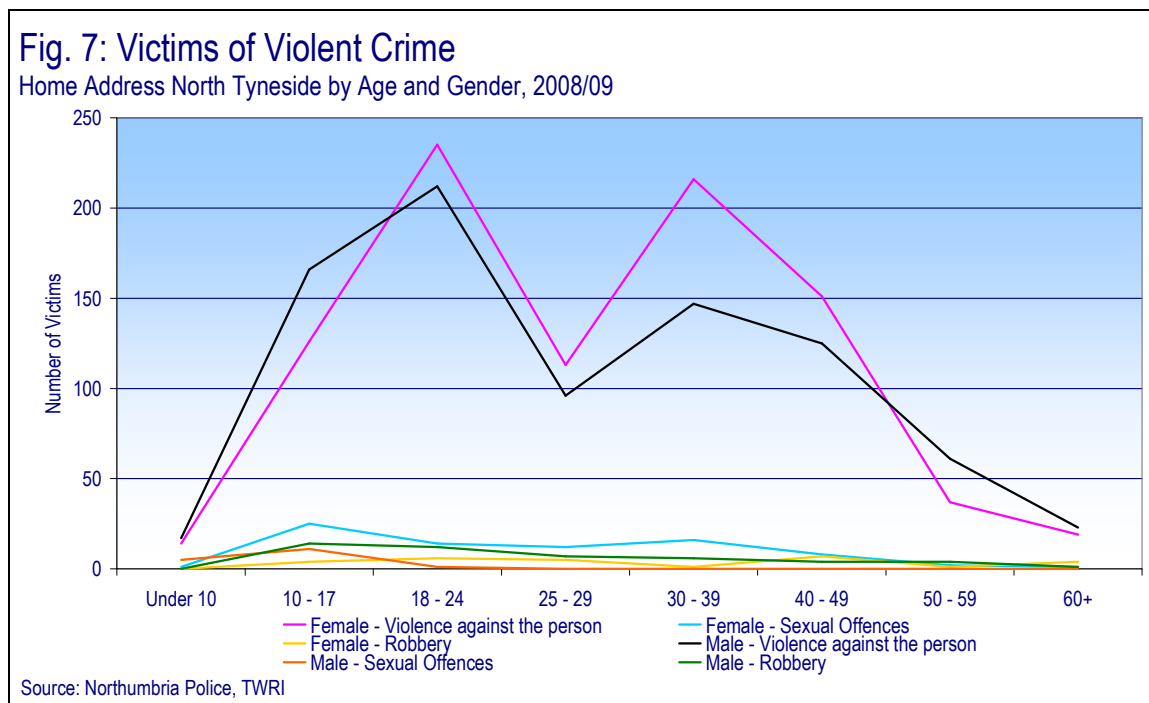

2.3 Age and Gender of Victims

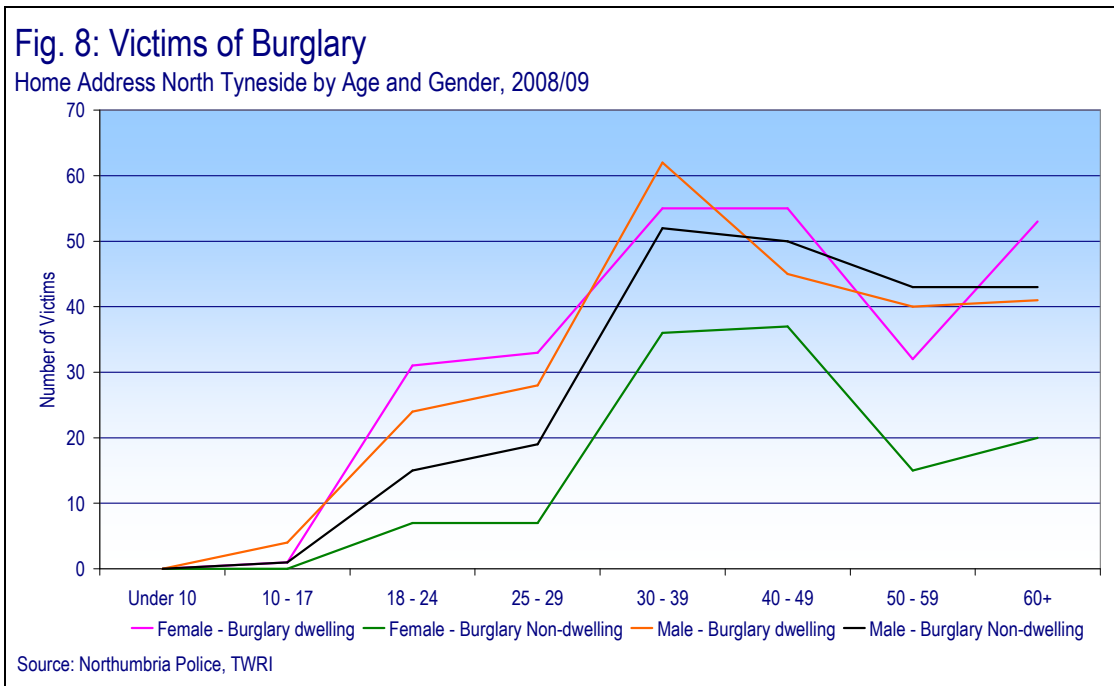
Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 47% of victims of crime were female, this compares to 52% of the total residential population of North Tyneside.
- 18–24 year olds accounted for the highest proportion (25%) of male victims of Violence Against the Person. They represented only 9% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.
- 61% of female victims of Violence Against the Person were aged 18-39. Females in this age group accounted for only 27% of the female residential population of North Tyneside.
- 18% of victims of Sexual Offences were male. Almost two thirds (64%) of these males were aged 10-17 despite accounting for only 9% of the male residential population of North Tyneside.
- 82% of victims of Sexual Offences were female. 33% of these female victims were aged under 18 years old, even though this age group accounted for only 19% of the female residential population of North Tyneside.
- 62% of victims of Robbery were male. Over half (54%) of these male victims were aged 10-24.



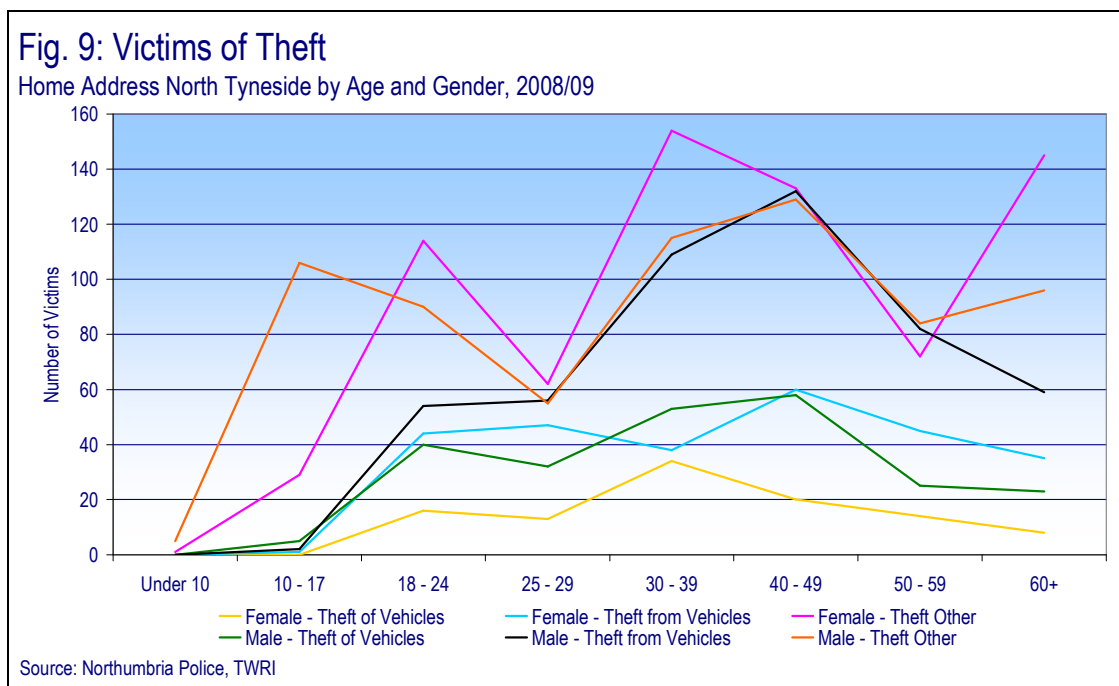
Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Almost 60% of female victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for only 28% of the female residential population of North Tyneside.



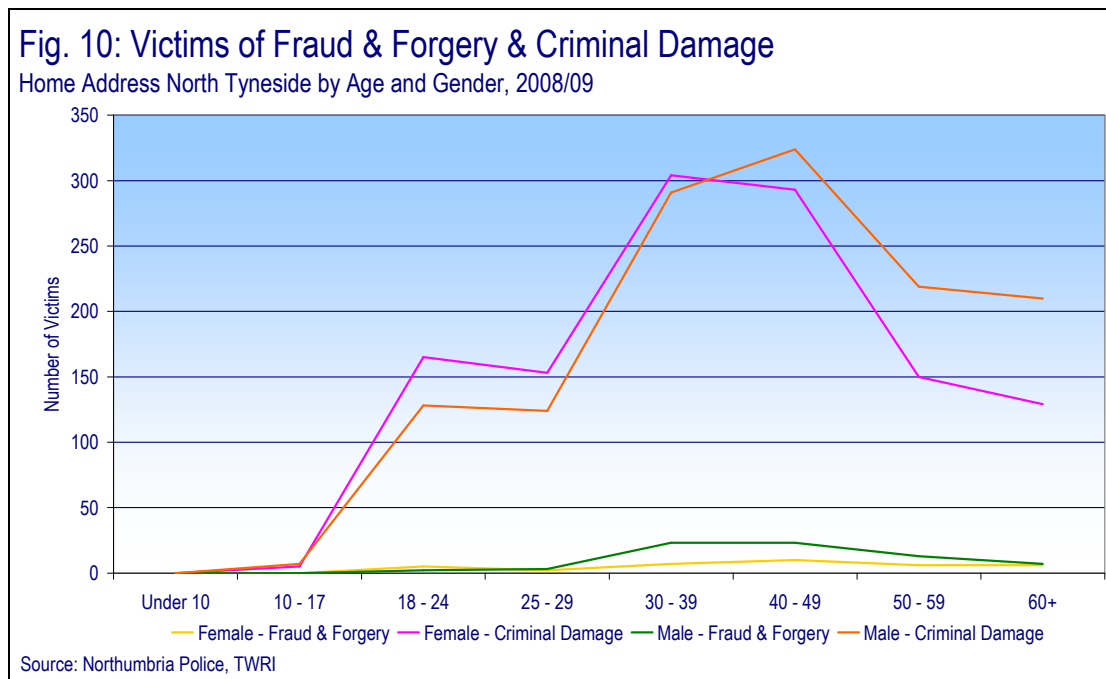
During 2008/09:

- 31% of Vehicle Theft and 35% of Theft from Vehicles victims living in North Tyneside were female.
- Over half of female victims of Theft of Vehicles living in North Tyneside were aged 30-49.
- 69% of Theft of Vehicles and 65% of Theft from Vehicles victims of crime were male.



Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Slightly over a third (34%) of victims of Fraud & Forgery were female. There were no female victims of Fraud & Forgery under the age of 18. 16% of female victims of Fraud & Forgery were aged 60 or over.
- 65% of victims of Fraud & Forgery were male, 64% of these victims were aged 30 -49 years old.



2.4 Ethnicity of Victims

Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 4.1% of all victims of crime were from a Black Minority Ethnic (BME) group. The BME population of North Tyneside is 4% of the overall population.
- 4% of victims of Violence Against the Person were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin.
- No victims of Sexual Offences came from a BME group.
- 5% of victims of Robbery were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin, this compares to just 1.6% of the total population of North Tyneside.
- 5% of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were from a BME group.

During 2008/09:

- Approximately 4% of victims of Theft from Vehicles, Theft Other and Criminal Damage living in North Tyneside were from a BME group.
- 13% of victims of Fraud & Forgery living in North Tyneside were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin. This compares to just 1.6% of the total population of North Tyneside.

2.5 Occupation of Victims

Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- 41% of victims of Violence Against the Person were in employment. The occupations with the highest number of victims were: Sales/Shop Assistant (69), Manager (23) and Taxi Driver (18).
- 40% of victims of Sexual Offences were school children. Employed people accounted for almost a quarter (23%) of victims of Sexual Offences.
- 44% of Robbery victims were employed.
- Over half (53%) of Burglary Dwelling victims and 70% of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were in employment. Occupations with the highest number of victims were managers (15), civil servants (10) nurses (9) and teachers (9) for Burglary Dwellings.

Victims who had a home address in North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- Two thirds of Theft of Vehicles victims and 78% of Theft from Vehicle victims were in employment. Occupations with highest number of victims of Vehicle Thefts were joiners (10), managers (9) and builders (8). Occupations with the highest number of Theft from Vehicles were managers (41) and taxi drivers (34). 8% of victims of Theft from Vehicles were retired.
- Just over one fifth (21%) of Criminal Damage victims were unemployed, whilst 11% were retired.

3. Violent Crime in North Tyneside and the Relationship between Victim and Perpetrator

During 2008/09 2,010 violent crimes were committed in North Tyneside. Of these crimes the majority (77%) were committed by a stranger. 19% of violent crime was classed as domestic violence³, where the offence was committed by a known family member or partner.

Victims of violent crime, whose home address was in North Tyneside followed a similar proportional split to where the crime was committed in North Tyneside.

³ The definition of domestic violence is 'Any incident of threatening behaviour, violence or abuse (psychological, physical, sexual, financial or emotional) between adults who are or have been intimate partners or family members, regardless of gender or sexuality' (Home Office 2005).

Men are more likely to be victims of violent crime on the street perpetrated by strangers. During 2008/09, 89% of male victims compared to 65% of female victims were attacked by strangers.

Women are more likely to be victims in the home perpetrated by someone known to them. During 2008/09, 16% of all victims of violent crime were females subjected to domestic violence.

The Tyneside Rape Crisis Centre (TRCC)⁴ provides information, support and counselling for women in Gateshead, Newcastle, North and South Tyneside who have been raped or sexually abused. During 2008/09, the TRCC received 287 initial enquiries. 31% of these calls related to adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse and 30% to adult sexual abuse or rape. The centre offers support rather than encouraging victims to report the crimes, though they help women if they decide to do that.

4. Property-Related Crime in North Tyneside

During 2008/09 there were 9,989 items of stolen property recorded by Northumbria Police in North Tyneside (where the crime was committed in North Tyneside). 1,615 (16%) of these items were recovered. The total value of property stolen (including that recovered) was approximately £3,611,071. The total value of property recovered was £665,489.

In North Tyneside during 2008/09:

- The most common item stolen was cash, accounting for 7% of all types of property stolen. The total amount of cash stolen was £492,662. This was 14% of the total value of all property stolen.
- Automobile thefts accounted for 4% of all types of property stolen, however, in monetary terms stolen automobiles accounted for 29% of the total value of all property stolen, the highest for any type of property.
- The most expensive item stolen was recorded as 'mobile phone'; however, this was as a result of systematic theft over a long period of time.

5. 'Business' Victims in North Tyneside

In 2008/09 there were 3,880 business victims of crime in North Tyneside. One third of these crimes were against Northumbria Police (this includes crimes against The Crown / Regina).

In 2008/09 there were 2,440 business victims of crime in North Tyneside, where the business 'home' address was given as being in North Tyneside. The crime will have been committed within Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within North Tyneside. The number of business victims with a 'home' address within North Tyneside is much lower than the number of victims of crimes committed in North Tyneside, as many organisations record their 'home' address as a headquarters office located outside of North Tyneside. This also explains the reduction in the number of Police / Regina victims, as in the majority of cases Northumbria Police Headquarters in Ponteland, Northumberland, outside of North Tyneside, is recorded as the victims 'home address'.

6. Location Profile of Victims in North Tyneside

In 2008/09 there were 8,081 victims of crime in North Tyneside. 88% of these victims also lived within North Tyneside.

6% of victims of crimes committed in North Tyneside lived in one of the four other Tyne & Wear districts. Of these 464 victims, 72% lived in neighbouring Newcastle.

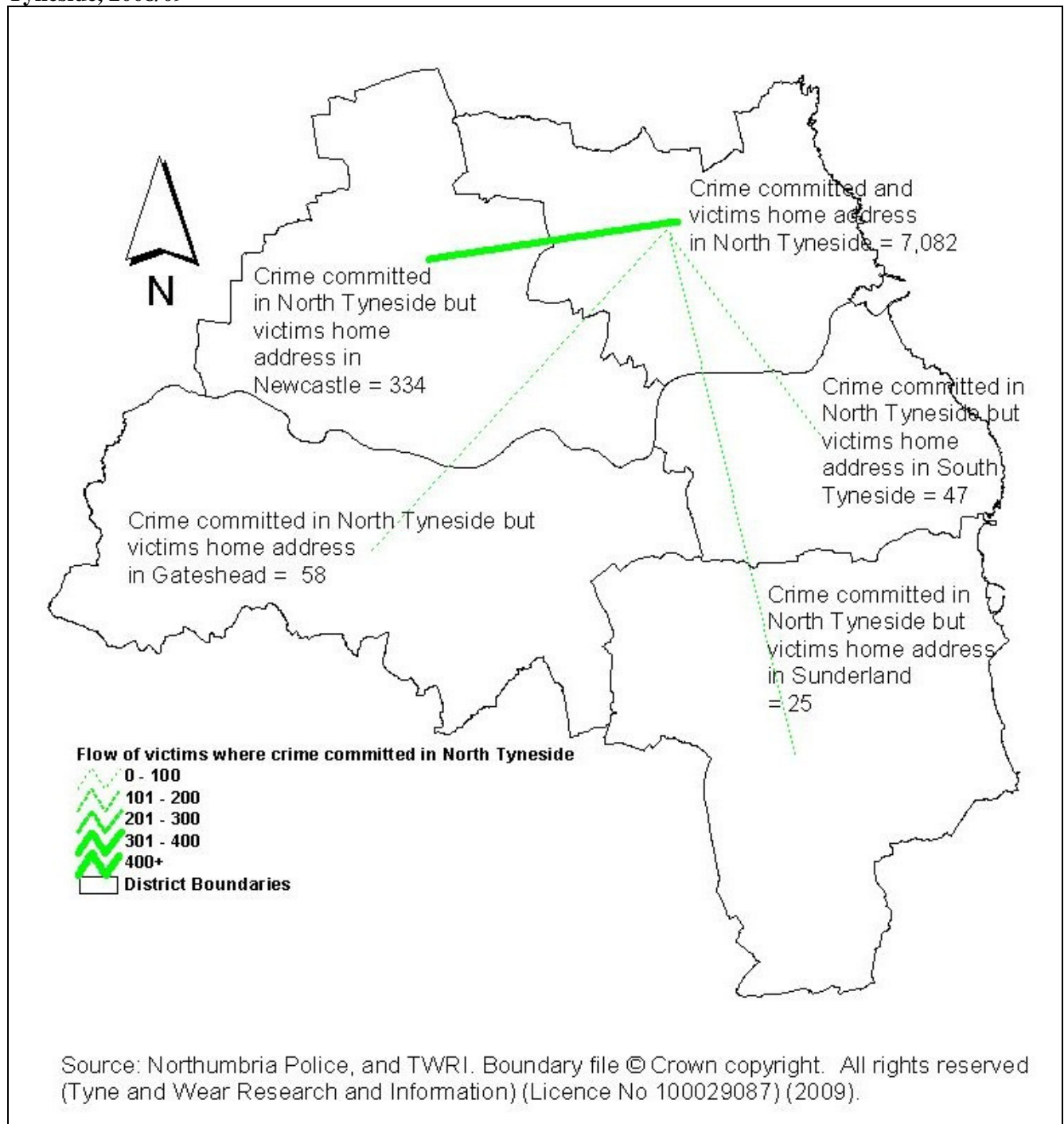
7% of victims of crimes committed in North Tyneside lived outside of Tyne & Wear. Almost 70% of these victims came from neighbouring Northumberland, whilst almost one quarter came from outside of the North East.

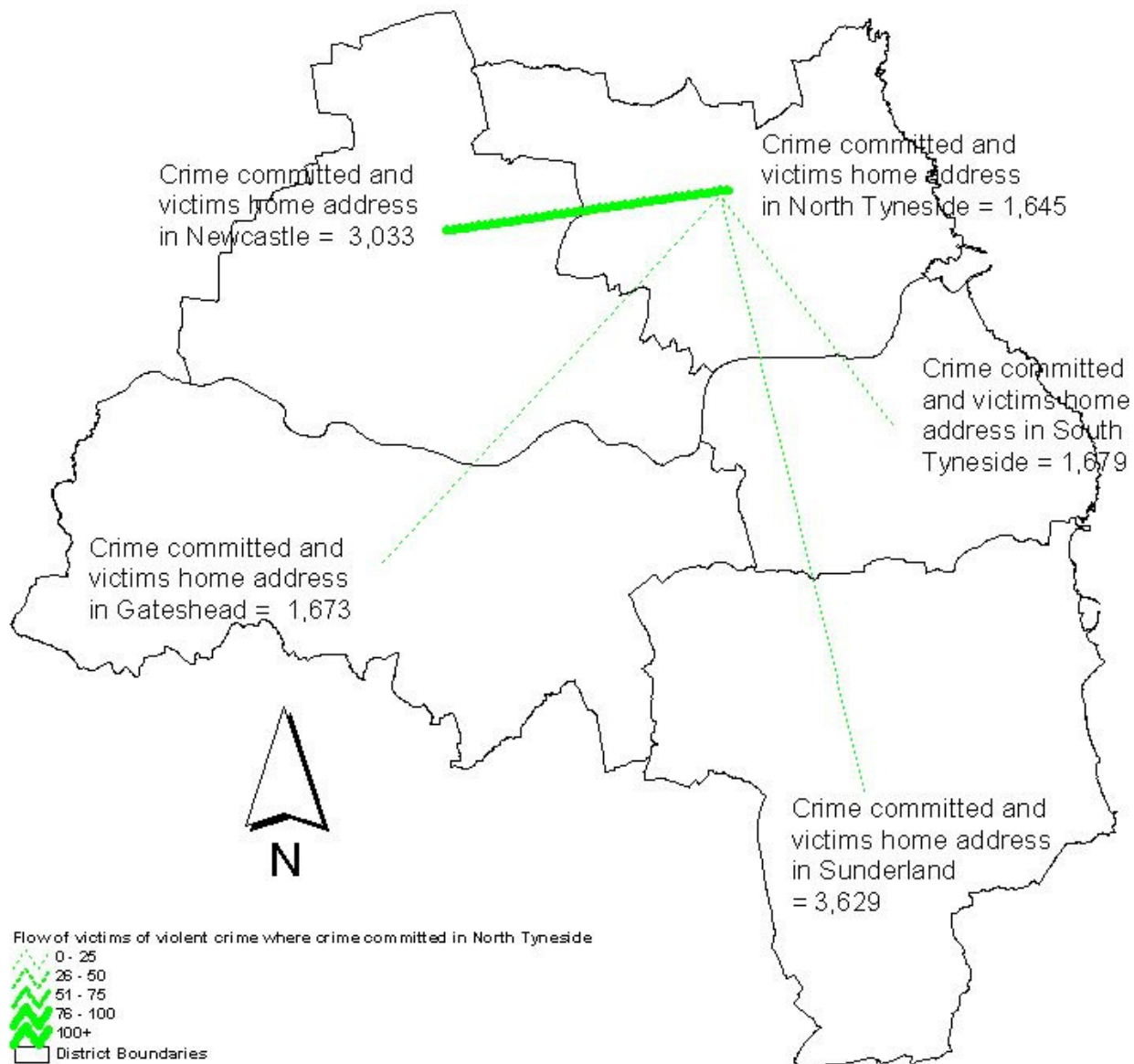

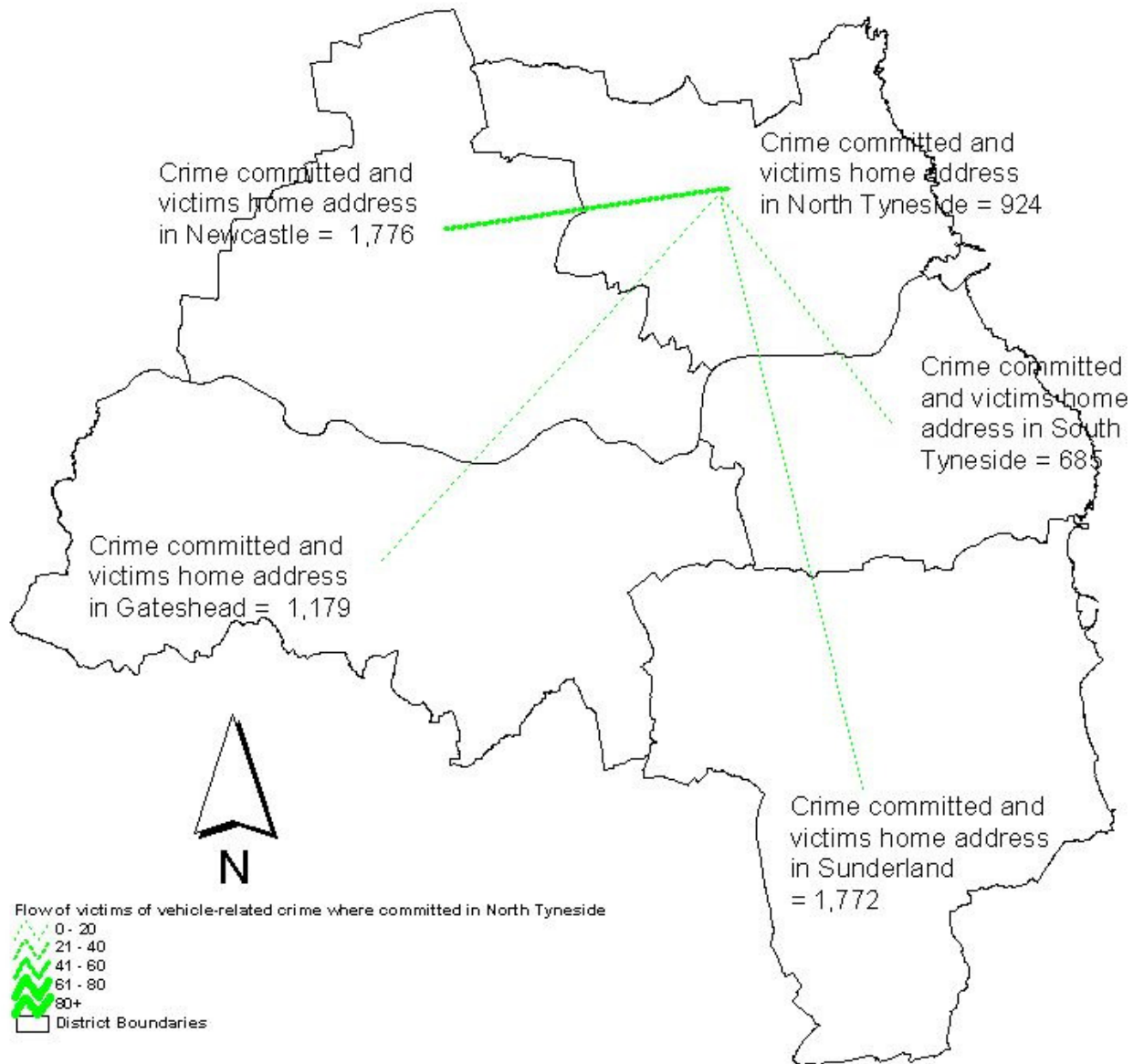

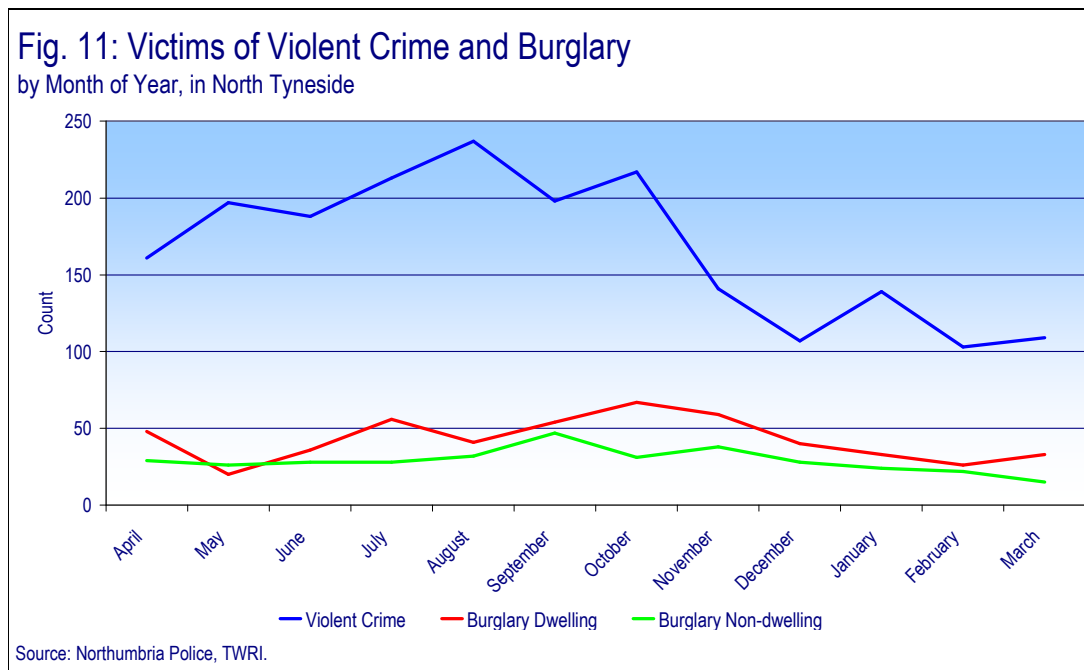
7. Temporal Profile of Victims in North Tyneside

Crime trends can be influenced by a range of factors that fluctuate according to time of the week or time of the year. Influencing factors include increased alcohol consumption in town centres at the weekend, influx of visitors/tourism, rain and low temperatures and seasonal holidays.

Recording the time at which some types of high volume crime take place can be problematic. For example, when vehicle crime takes place overnight, or when a burglary takes place while the occupier is on holiday. There will be a range, covering the earliest and latest times possible for the offence to have occurred. For the purposes of this report the earliest time and date for the offence to have occurred has been used.

During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

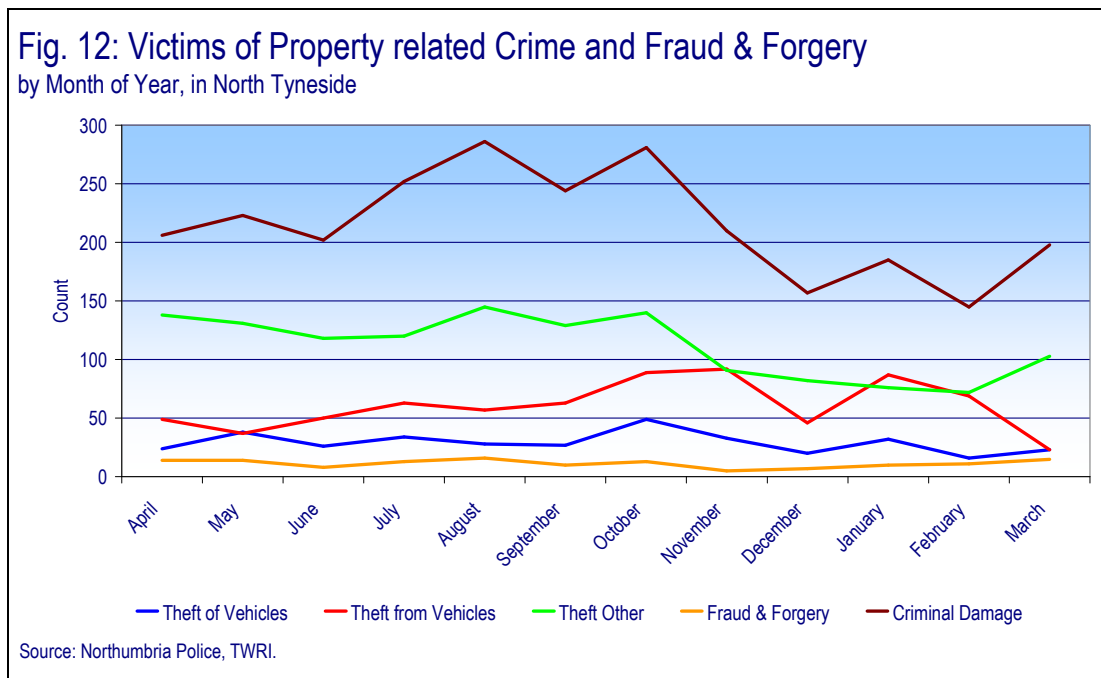
- There were on average 168 victims of violent crime per month. July to September quarter saw the most victims of this type of crime. August had the highest number of violent crime victims and February the lowest.
- There were on average 43 victims of Burglary Dwelling per month. October to December quarter had the most victims of Burglary Dwellings. October had the highest number of Burglary Dwellings victims and May the lowest number.
- There were on average 29 victims of Burglary Non-dwellings per month. July to September quarter had the most Burglary Non-dwellings victims. September had the highest number of Burglary Non-dwelling victims and March the lowest number.



During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

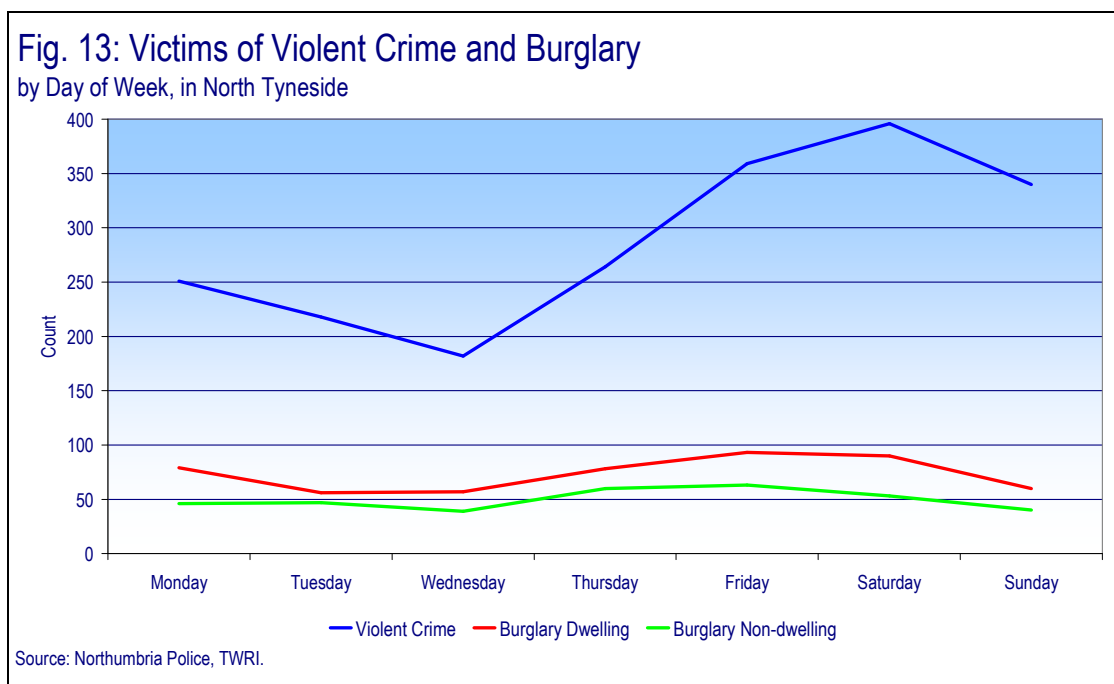
- There were on average 29 victims of Theft of Vehicle per month. The autumn quarter of October to December had the most victims of Theft of Vehicles. October had the highest number of Theft of Vehicle victims and February the lowest.
- On average there were 60 victims of Theft from Vehicle per month. As for Theft of Vehicles, the autumn quarter of October to December had the most Theft from Vehicles. November had the highest number of Theft from Vehicles victims and March the lowest.
- There were on average 112 Theft Other victims per month. July to September quarter had the most Theft Other victims. August had the highest number of Theft Other victims and February the lowest.
- There were on average 11 Fraud & Forgery victims per month.

- There were on average 216 victims of Criminal Damage per month. The summer quarter of July to September had the most Criminal Damage victims. The number of Criminal Damage victims was highest in August and the lowest in February.



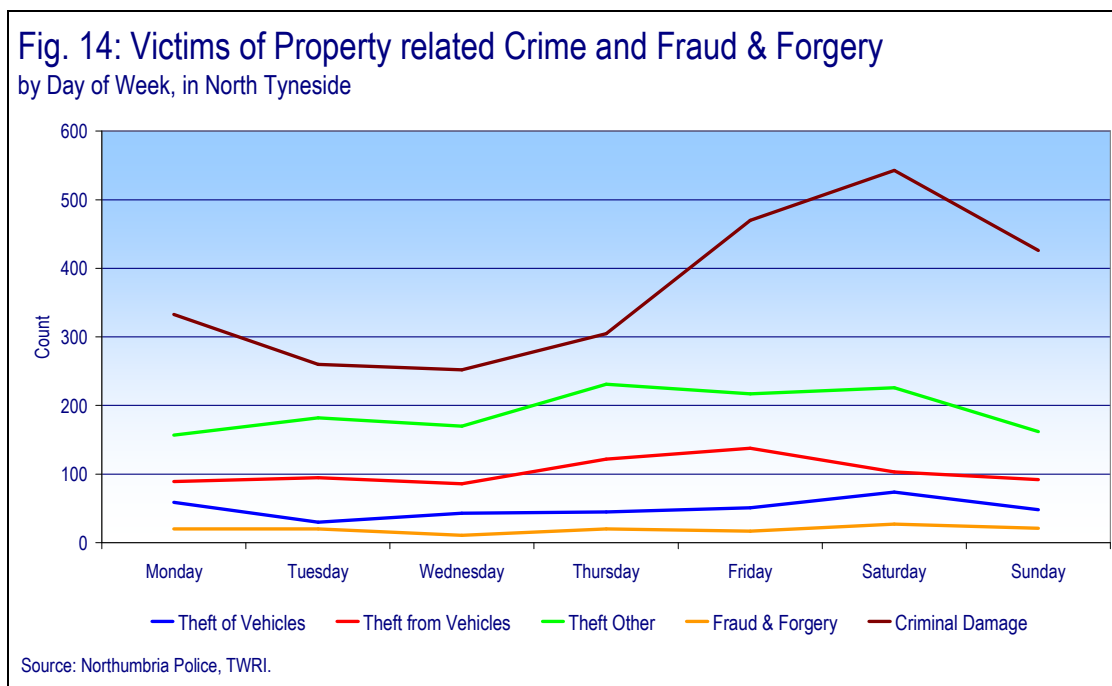
During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

- There were on average 287 victims of Violent Crime per day of the week. Fridays and Saturdays saw the highest numbers of victims of Violent Crime. This could be due to the increased levels of alcohol-related crimes associated with weekend drinking. The least number of Violent Crime victims were recorded on Wednesdays (average 182).
- There were on average 73 victims of Burglary Dwelling and 50 of Burglary Non-dwelling per day of the week. Fridays saw the highest numbers of victims of Burglary Dwelling. The lowest numbers of victims of Burglary Dwelling was on Tuesdays.



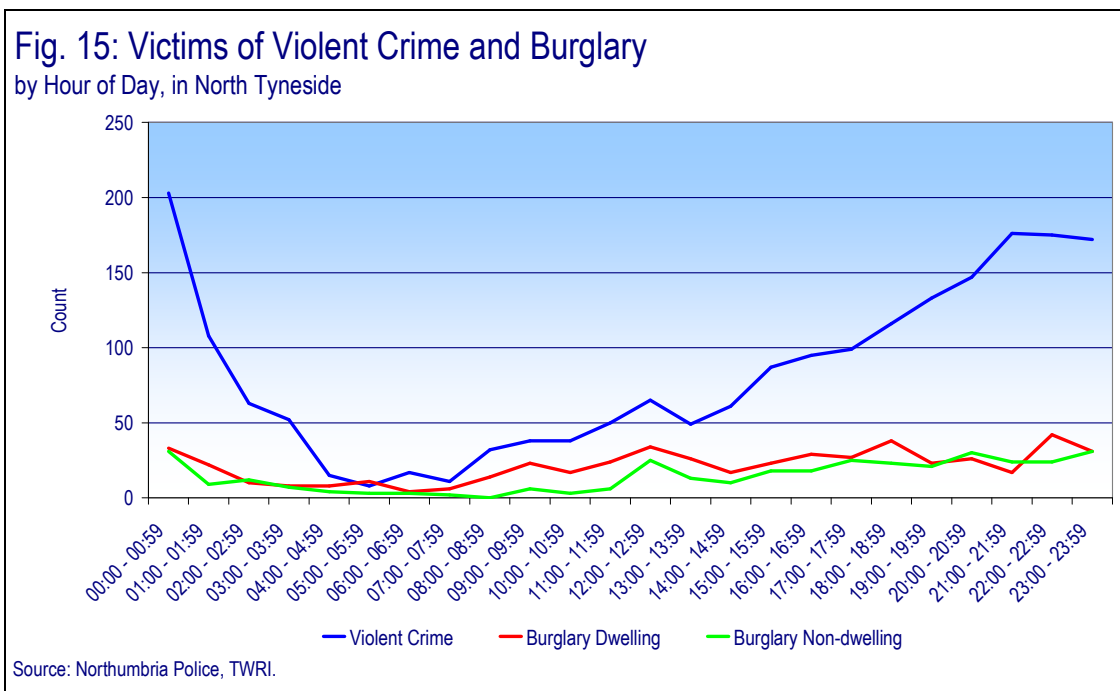
During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

- The likelihood of being a victim of Theft of or from Vehicles was fairly consistent across the week. There were on average 50 victims of Theft of Vehicles and 104 Theft from Vehicles per day of the week.
- On average there were 192 victims of Theft Other per day of the week. Thursdays and Saturdays saw the highest numbers. The least number of Theft Other victims were on Mondays.
- The likelihood of being a victim of Fraud & Forgery was consistent across the week. There were on average 19 victims per day of the week.
- There were on average 370 victims of Criminal Damage per day of the week. Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays saw the highest numbers of victims of Criminal Damage, averaging 480 per day. The least number of Criminal Damage victims were on a Wednesday (252).



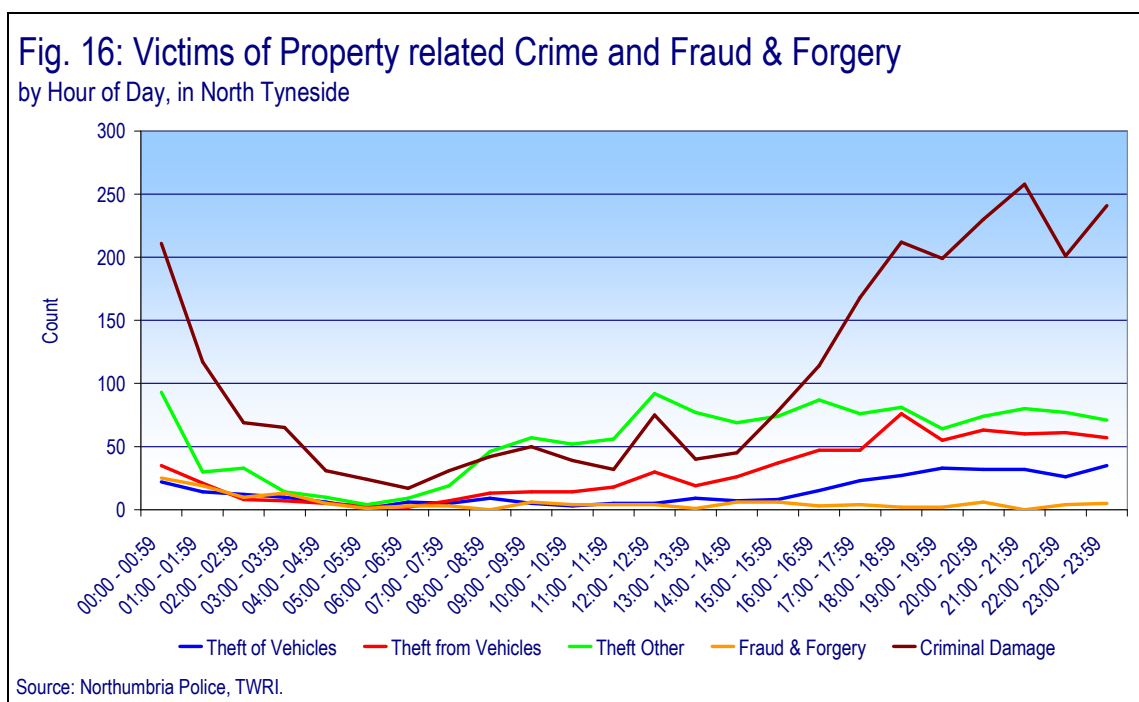
During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

- There was a steady increase in the number of victims of violent crime from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 12am and 1am. The number of victims between 9pm and 2am accounted for 41% of all violent crime victims. Between 2am and 6am the number of victims fell sharply.
- There was a small peak in the number of violent crime victims between 12-1pm. Victims aged between 10 and 17 accounted for approximately 17% of all violent crime victims during this hour, coinciding with school lunch breaks.
- The number of victims of Burglary Dwelling was fairly evenly split across the day. There were small peaks in the number of victims of Burglary Dwelling between 12-1pm, 6-7pm and 10-11pm. The pattern of Burglary Dwellings for retired people followed a similar pattern to that of all Burglary Dwelling victims, with peaks between 12-1pm, 6-7pm and 10-11pm. Whilst for those in employment peaks occurred between 10-11pm and 12-1am.
- The number of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling was fairly evenly split across the day, with small peaks between 12- 1pm and 8-9pm. This peak followed a relatively large dip between 9-10pm.



During 2008/09 in North Tyneside:

- There was a steady increase in the number of victims of Vehicle Crime from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 6-7pm for Theft from Vehicles and 7-8pm for Theft of Vehicles. This could perhaps be explained by workers parking vehicles in car parks or on streets, whilst at work or shopping. The fall in the number of Vehicle Crimes during the evening and night could be due to vehicles being parked more securely in garages or on driveways.
- The number of victims of Theft Other crimes increased from early morning (6-7am) to peak between 12-1pm. The number of Theft Other victims was relatively consistent across the afternoon and evening.
- The number of victims of Fraud & Forgery was consistently spread across the day.
- The number of victims of Criminal Damage increased from early morning (6-7am) to peak between 9-10pm. There were smaller peaks around 12-1pm and 6-7pm. From 1pm to 10pm the number of Criminal Damage victims increased by over six times from 40 to 258.
